

ands will cover ears. Parents will wince. The music is diabolical. Rock's bastard child, heavy metal, has been through the ringer. It's no longer relegated to jeans, leather motorcycle jackets, and long hair. Heck, even Black Sabbath and Kiss have sharpened their devilish hoofs again. This form of music, created from the underground, for the


underground, has had major bouts with mainstream acceptance. Within metal, the sub-genres run the gamut, with titles like thrash, alternative, death, goth, hardcore, grunge, industrial, punk, progressive and even retro metal. It's all fairly complex for a sound commonly accepted as "noise."

In the '90s, the face of metal has undergone its biggest make-over to

date. Just like Seattle's Nirvana K.O.ed arena rock hair bands like Poison, Bon Jovi, and Def Leppard earlier in this decade, new bands like Korn, Deftones, and Fear Factory are injecting the metal genre with today's hottest fashions; Tear-away track pants, yellow-tinted shades, tattoos, driving guitars, and a nod of recognition towards hiphop's meteoric rise in popularity.

# KORN After The Rock Is Dead Tour

It's that bleeding of power chords into modern technology that has seen, in the past few years, two very different underground genres: heavy metal and hiphop, combine. L.A.'s Korn, has successfully found the middle ground. Frazzled critics, who can't pigeon-hole their brand of heavy music, or even begin to under-

stand the millions of Korn fanatics, have gone so far as to call them the "Backstreet Boys of metal."

They can call us whatever they want," says 28 year-old guitarist Munky (a.k.a. James Shaffer) from New Haven, Connecticut. "We're always going to be Korn. It's just a label, and there are always going to be labels to let readers

understand the kind of music Korn is all about. I think it's a heavy hip-hop groove band with melodic vocals. That's how I would describe our music."


Feeling further and further away from his Orange County, Los Angeles home, Munky, along with

"We were just discussing the direction of our next album and we want to get heavier...like the first Korn record," says Munky.

singer/lyricist Jonathan Davis, bassist Fieldy, guitarist Head, and drummer David Silveria are used to touring hard. When Korn was out supporting their sophomore effort, *Life Is Peachy* (1996), they would go for weeks without taking a day off. Rumors persist that a bus driver quit, stating that the tour was the hardest one he had driven for in twenty years.

Presently Korn has completed

a stint with Rob Zombie playing to enthusiastic fans across the U.S. Initially. Korn was a little bit nervous about the Rock is Dead tour, as far as the pressures of trying to match their success with Family Values. But needless to say everything went just fine, except for a small snag on only the second night of the tour when a truck transporting some of both bands' equipment broke down and failed to meet Korn and Zombie in Albuquerque. But the show must go on as they say, and it did, if a little stripped down. Both acts regained their equipment the next day, and the tour was a constant success from that point forward. Now that the tour is over, Korn is reported to record a song with the hiphop act Outkast.

"People should know that I'm really thankful for everything,"Munky says of Korn's current kings-of-the- Above, Head. He got the nickname hard-rock-mountain position, "but, we've worked hard. We've toured and

given more than one hundred percent for this band, from the beginning.

"When we started, it seemed like there was nothing that would hold this band back from being successful. We weren't going to let anything stand in our way. That was our attitude, and we still have that attitude. We just wanted to come out and create something new, which is not easy to do these days. It's all been done before and I don't think we're doing anything all that different. It's just how we present ourselves and deliver it."


Korn has gone on to do so much since delivering their third disc, Follow The Leader (an apt title, if ever there was one), which marched to the number one position atop Billboard's chart. The current slew of hard-edged bands and major label record companies are simply following what sells, and what sells is Korn. All three of Korn's releases, their self-titled debut (1994), then Life Is Peachy, and now Follow The Leader (which features guest appearances by Ice Cube, Limp Bizkit's Fred Durst, Pharcyde's Tre, and even Cheech Marin of Cheech & Chong fame), have individually sold millions of copies to legions of new and loyal Korn and hard rock fans, who are celebrated on the new disc in the song Children of the Korn.

"I think the majority of people understand what we're doing," says Munky of Korn's lyrical mixture which pits Davis' sarcasm against his darkday-to-day demons.

"I think people are catching on. I also think it has a lot to do with our fans being able to relate with Jonathan's lyrics. That's why our fans are very faithful to us. Bad stuff happens to everybody, and people can relate to that. I know that I can relate to what Jonathan is singing about."

With platinum discs, sold-out tours, popular Korn "After School Special" broadcasts over the Internet, their own record label (Elementree, distributed through Warner Brothers), Puma Clothing custom designing their wears, and the hit singles 'Got The Life' and 'Freak On A Leash' from Follow The Leader, one big question remains: what's left for Korn?

"Whatever happens, happens," Munky philosophizes. "I guess it isn't very underground anymore, is it? That's a tough question. I feel that we're still a part of the underground. When I see the fans, and how die-hard they are, I feel like we're still underground. I think only a few of our really die-hard fans really want us to stay on the underground scene. It's tough, we're in a position right now," he admits of their mainstream hugeness.

"We're either going to stay an underground band or we're just going to blow the roof off. Our music will never be commercial sounding, we're always going to be heavy. We were just discussing the direction for our next album and we want to get heavier. Heavy ass, like the first Korn record. Raw, and backing off on all the effects, back to just being straight-forward

groove, like some old Sepultura or Soulfly. We want back some of those heavy-fat grooves we had when we first started the band. That's what we're talking about doing now."

Regarding the possibilities for a new home video that could include some strange footage of Follow The Leader guests like Cheech and Ice Cube Munky says excitedly, "We've got some footage that is just unbelievable.

"One of my really good friends, his name is Danny Hamilton, has some unbelievable footage from way back, when we first started. Actually he has footage when we were in the rehearsal studio in Anaheim, California and we were writing the song 'Faget' and working the parts out. It's all on video. He's also taped some of our very first gigs, with four or five

people in the crowd, and we're like 'and our next song, mom is....'" Munky laughs as he recalls those days, long gone, as arenas worldwide beckon his band.

"This guy has filmed the earliest stuff we've done to the latest stuff from this tour. He's with us, filming every day. That stuff is cool, because it's totally us, not like making music videos. Making videos is cool, it's a trip. They get these big old cameras in front of your face and I'm like 'man, I just started playing guitar, I didn't know that I was going to have to act and shit'," he laughs. "Here I am acting. After we blew up the car in the 'Got The Life' video, our director was like 'look surprised and happy.' We're like 'what? I can't

act.' It was actually pretty funny."

And finally, in a day and age where people's tastes change quicker than surfing from website to website, Munky, and the rest of Korn, believe that it's about the music. Above the clothes, the tours and videos. Korn has to be about making music they believe in and working with people they can trust. "I think that we just want to keep our fans involved," Munky argues. "Like they're a part of it, because they are. They're part of the whole Korn process, without the fans loving our bands we'd be working at Pizza Hut or something. We appreciate it and we want them to feel appreciated. They see that all this fame has really just started to escalate recently, with the release of Follow The Leader. I think one of our major challenges is to figure out how to make more time and be more available to our fans."

"I think that we just wanted to keep our fans involved. They're a part of the whole Korn process, without the fans loving our bands we'd be working at Pizza Hut or something," said Munky.



#### rgy lead, Jay Gordon describes his breakthrough album, Candvass as "a bunch of lies and fairy tales", while their producer and sixth member, Josh Abraham describes the debut masterpiece as "five-in-the-morning, pissed-off, fighting-witheach-other, kill-eachother kinda stuff". 


A Candid interview with lead vocalist Jay Gordon

Being the first band Korn signed on their new Elementree Records label wasn't just dumb luck for Orgy, but due to the fact that Jay Gordon had a working relationship with Korn frontman, Jon Davis long before anybody heard of the Bakersfield quintet (or even before they had a record contract of their own.) The two shared the same management company and used to hang out and play in the same clubs. So once Korn found their own label where they made all the decisions, naturally Orgy was their first choice. The five guys from Orgy, Jay

Gordon (vox), Amir Derakh (g-synth), Ryan Shuck (guitar), Paige Haley (bass), Bobby Hewitt (drums), certainly agree that it's a privilege to be signed with a label that is run by musicians and not by a bunch of bourgeois, money-seeking, record company suits.


"But you know the best thing, the very best thing about it all is that we have a great label, it's fantastic to be part of a label that is run by real people, guys like us, and not some guys in suits."



Small wonder that the rebellious allure of music didn't do wonders for his achievements in school once Jay discovered this new passion. He completely lost interested in everything that concerned books, pencils, and school so to focus completely into his music.

"I was a rather good pupil until high school, but when I decided to concentrate on music, to play more music, the teachers started to bore me to death. Somehow I managed to finish high school, but I still don't know how I did that, don't ask me how. I realized that I'd need a job, so I [studied to become a sound engineer and I guess that's the direction in which I want to go: production and movies. But not now, sometime later in my life, not straight away, for the moment, Orgy is pretty important."


ferent scenes.

But I'm used to be in a real band, being a member of a band and not just being locked away in a studio. If you're in a real band there's so much more going on, especially on stage. Far more visual effects and all that."

Another reason why he thinks it's so important to be in a band is, that Orgy loves playing live.

"We know how to use a computer, but it's important to produce that sound live on stage. We're listening to tons and tons of stuff, like albums, new album, old albums, and then we find a sound, or just a fragment of a sound we like and we sample it, change it around and come up with a new sound. Our drummer Steve has a brand new system, he can play it live... We don't want a computer on stage, we're a rock band with a singer, not a studio project. Okay, we often face some technical difficulties, but so what? We've managed to overcome them so far and we'll continue to do so."

Jay starts explaining what was the original idea behind Orgy and why the glam punks embraced the electronic sound with such a ferocity:

"We wanted to do something else, something completely different. Our guitars shouldn't sound like guitars, but like weird space sounds. I love drums, real drums, and I love a real bassist, but there's no reason that a bass should sound like a real bass. The technique is always going forward and is giving us new dimensions to work with, some real sound adventures and it would be really narrow minded not to use them. There's no reason not to use everything that's available."

His background as a sound engineer also started to give him the habit to collect drum machines, he confesses that he collects them excessively

"I think I own a graveyard of drum machines, they always fascinated me. Of course, now they're all outdated, but I still keep them, they sound so cool and you can always use them again. I'm not parting with them."

Jay Gordon already explained that his previous musical tastes helped him to "assimilate" a lot of different styles, but his influences are firmly panted in the 80's new wave and electronic roots and not in the 90's sometimes gruff industrial genre, even if he is a fan.

"Of course I listen to industrial, I like Skinny Puppy, Ministry, Nine Inch Nails and all that, there are a lot of cool elements in industrial. But I think it's a bit boring to listen to the same loop over and over, for a lot of people it's just noise. I think the gothic element has a lot more feelings to offer and it makes our sound more accessible for people.

"I think it all started in the 80's, they paved a way, music was accessible for almost everybody due to the new technologies that were available. Depeche Mode, New Order, Scritti Politti, Eurythmics, Bauhaus, The Sisters of Mercy, they showed that there are new dimensions in music, they opened doors and we're trying to walk through one."

Gordon says, that 80's new wave and electronic roots "showed new dimensions in music, they opened doors and we're trying to walk through one."

cavernous one that has been influenced by the imagery and shape of a place that will take shape in the future.



hip-hop, and Italian horror movies. Is that the Reader's Digest version of what you are about?





HIS FIRST SOLO ATTEMPT SINCE WHITE ZOMBIE AND HIS TOUR WITH KORN.

The critical acclaim of singer Rob Zombie continues to mutate along with his creative tenacity. Now, he's a true solo man, Rob Zombie, with his debut solo outing, Hellbilly Deluxe. He's come a long way from the band that got put in the spotlight when two cartoon people named Beavis & Butt-Head described them as "uh-uh-uh...cool." Rob Zombie and his cast of players delivered a huge punch with '95's Astro-Creep 2000 (which was followed a year later by the remix disc, Supersexy Swingin' Sounds).

"For some reason, when I think about White Zombie, it seems long, like a lot of work and not a lot of fun for me," says Zombie about the transition from band to solo effort. "When I look back on this record, even though it took me three times longer to



record than Astro-Creep, it seemed like it flew by and it was a fucking blast to

"There's something about Astro-Creep... when I was making it, I thought that I'd never want to make another fucking record. It just seemed like such a miserable experience, I was so over it. I finished Hellbilly, and literally the next day I was jonesing to make another record. I actually went back into the studio and recorded a Halloween track with The Ghastly Ones, because I was still in recording mode and felt like I wasn't done yet."

The Ghastly Ones (whose debut, A-Haunting We Will Go-Go) are one of two bands that are signed to Rob's own label, Zombie A Go-Go, which is distributed by DGC/Universal

(the other release is The Bomboras' Head Shrinkin' Fun). Another creative notch in this Demon Funkster's leather belt (placed strategically next to his five Grammy nominations and MTV video award for directing).

But, nightmares seem to be a running theme for this haunted-house figure who cruises through LA with virtual anonymity, several million albums sold, tons of cool soundtrack stuff, and his own whacked form of art (see any piece of Zombie's promo and it's Rob's work ...plus he's begun work on a comic book).

"It's a kind of weird thing," he says of life in the not-so spotlight. "A lot of it I do on purpose, and a lot of it happens by accident. People come up to me all the time and say, 'don't you

wish that someday you could be as big as this band,' and I'm like 'fuck dude, I've sold three times the amount of records of that band.' Nobody knows White Zombie was a big thing with a low profile.

"It's kind of cool, because I'm not like a Hollywood swinger. I don't want to go out or hang out and be photographed and be a big shot. I just have my friends, and they're not even in the music business. It keeps my mind focused on the work and what I'm trying to do. I really don't get caught up in the 'game' or nonsense.

"When I was working on the next "Crow" movie, the third movie, and I had been working on it for over a year and a half and it just seemed to be going nowhere fast, I was exhausted

> and getting migraines, so I figured, 'I'm going to write some fucking music, just for the hell of it.' I didn't even know or have a reason, other than it being a stress release. I was working with my friend Charlie from Nine Inch Nails for about a week, then he moved back to New Orleans, to start on the new Nine Inch Nails. By that point, it had only taken a week for me to get back into the songwriting swing of things. I just started working with a lot of people and figured it'd be a

cool EP or something with a comic conflict with White Zombie," says Rob of how

this whole *Hellbilly Deluxe* mess got started.

"I just kept going and going until it became, 'fuck I'm going to make a whole album!' John Tempesta (White Zombie's drummer and current member of Rob's solo band), lived across the street from me and he was going out of his mind. When a drummer can't play, they become mental patients," he laughs. "He was like 'fuck, let me play, I'm going crazy! 'So it just kind of escalated from there into a full-blown thing."

Full blown indeed, before Korn/Zombie's Rock Is Dead Tour, Rob spent a weekend in Los Angeles filming four videos and a commercial for *Hellbilly Deluxe*. "What Lurks On Channel X?", "Meet The Creeper", "How To Make A Monster" and a new version of "Living Dead Girl". The

videos were uniquely shot on one soundstage that had five individual sets rotated in. All this from a small studio session, at a friend's house with some unique guests.

"I recorded it at Scott Humphrey's house," says Zombie of producer/friend. "People would come in and out all the time. Tommy Lee was one of his best friends, I didn't even know Tommy at that time. When all the shit started going down Tommy Pamela, he literally moved into the house for months while I was recording. I'd see him everyday around the house and I was like 'fuck, if you're going to sit around all day, you might as well play.' He played on 'Meet The

Creeper' and 'The Ballad of Resurrection Joe and Rosa Whore'.

Since Charlie from Nine Inch Nails was also living in the house for awhile, Danny(Lohner) would come out and visit and I was like 'fuck dude, play guitar.' And that's how everything worked. Nobody could enter the house without somehow winding up on my record," he laughs.

Talking about his past with White Zombie, Rob admits that, "I'm having a lot of fun and I've put a lot of fucking work into *Hellbilly*. White Zombie had fallen into a pattern and something needed to inject a new life into that band. A lot times, through the course of the years, that injection came when old members split and new members came in, and that really kicked us in the ass. I just wanted to do something different on my own, really

just go for it."

And something different he did. With Hellbilly Deluxe flying off store shelves, Rob Zombie became notorious for extravagant stage shows. A small snag came when Rob Zombie's spot on the last Family Values tour was declined because of a disagreement between Rob Zombie's and Korn's management agencies, But neither Rob nor Korn took it personally, and after their respective management agencies buried the hatchet, Korn and Rob Zombie went on the road together as one big beastly caricature. Rob and Co. along with the boys from Korn and Videodrone trekked across the United States on their aptly entitled Rock is Dead tour.

Despite his monstrous appearance, Zombie cruises through LA with virtual anonymity.

And with such success inevitably a new album will follow. Significant Other which is the band's second album in the works is said to be due out on July 6th and is produced by Terry Date, the producer of the Deftones' first album. And along with the original Limp Bizkit line up, the new album will feature several guests including Eminem, Les Claypool (Primus), Method Man (Wu Tang Clan), Jonathan Davis (Korn), Scott

Weiland (Stone Temple Pilots), and Serj Tankian.

And if you're itching to get out and see these guys, rumor has it that a tour is in the works with Kid Rock and Stained. Also the buzz is they will be headlining the second annual Family Values Tour, and they are tentatively scheduled to play at Woodstock '99 in Rome, NY (July 23-25). So don't miss them!

## the Band, the History, and the "Rock is Dead Tour"

### MARILYN MANSON

The last person most people would expect to quote Neitzche, and to structure a book after Dante's "Inferno" is Marilyn Manson. A man who some believe is out for a quick buck, shocking appearance and not much more. But with three albums and an EP under his belt, this artist, seems to be here to stay and those who take the time to look past his appearance will find an intelligent, articulate man who has the ability to express raw emotions.

Marilyn Manson, a Canton, Ohio native, was born January 5, 1969 as Brian Warner. He moved to Fort Lauderdale, Florida when he was 18, and it was there that the band Marilyn Manson was formed, each member taking on the name of a sex symbol and a serial killer mashed together.

In recent news, Manson proposed to his long-time girlfriend (well in this industry at least), 23-year-old actress Rose McGowan in mid-February. The two can be seen together in the recent movie "Jawbreaker" in which McGowan plays the lead role and Manson has a cameo.

Manson also tried his foot at directing this year when he co-directed the band's video for the song "I Don't Like The Drugs (But the Drugs Like Me)" with Paul Hunter. On February 25, 1999 Mechanical Animals went

platinum, and has since sold worldwide more than two million copies.

Manson also told Circus Magazine that he is working on a script for a movie that he will hopefully make next year. Among his favorite directors that he would like to work with are David Lynch ("The Lost Highway") and Terry Gilliam ("Fear and Loathing in Las Vegas").

In other, relatively funny news, according to Manson's web-site, apparently there is a scam artist in the Detroit area that is trying to pass himself off as Marilyn Manson's manager and he's got a side kick that looks like Ginger Fish. Don't be fooled.

### THE TOUR

Marilyn Manson hit the stage this Winter/Spring with Hole (originally) and Monster Magnet on the "Rock is Dead Tour", originally entitled the "Beautiful Monsters Tour". Reportedly the new name was decided on after the group heard about the Korn/Rob Zombie tour of the same name. Marilyn Manson having a song entitled "Rock is Dead" on their latest album *Mechanical Animals*, and having used the phrase for years on T-shirts felt they were the only one's capable of carrying it off.

The tour which started in February will be concluding its US dates on April 27th in Minneapolis,

MN. It will then pick up in Sweden on June 18th and continue in Europe until July 10th wrapping up in Milton Keynes, U.K.

Although rumors were swirling about bickering between Courtney Love and Marilyn Manson it was reported that these were just publicity stunts. But on March 14 (their LA show), Hole officially left the tour and Manson didn't seem too upset about the break. Speaking of breaks, or sprains, this same show was the one in which Manson reinjured his already sprained ankle and was rushed to the hospital six songs into his set, forcing him to cancel three shows on the tour.

### THE BAND

In 1989 a photojournalist student, Manson, met up with a guitarist, Daisy Berkowitz, and the two decided to start up a band that was, as we all know, a little different from the norm. Marilyn Manson And The Spooky Kids is what they called themselves and these two Floridians along with their nameless drum machine and equally nameless bassist (who quite after one show, and latter became the singer of another band, "Collapsing Lungs", I wouldn't go looking for the album, seems like a waste of time.) Shocked Fort Lauderdale's rock scene like they would soon shock the world.

Gidget Gein came onto the

scene as the band's new bassist and Madonna Wayne Gacy (Pogo) was added on the keyboard and the then four-some paraded around in their

dresses and used any props they could for a little stage-attention (metal lunch boxes, light bright, whatever seemed fitting.) I n 1990, they released their first documented demo tape entitled "After School Special" and later on in that year released yet another demo, "Lunchbox" and went on to open for Nine Inch Nails.

Before long Lee Sara Lucas replaced the drum machine and the band count went up to five, but don't start memorizing them yet, they're going to change.

In August of 1992 the band cut their name from Marilyn Manson and

the Spooky Kids to just Marilyn Manson, and around that same time released the last of their demos "Refrigerator".

By winter of 1993, Gein was dismissed by the band because of a reported heroin addiction. He was replaced by Twiggy Ramirez (who at the time was the guitarist for another Florida metal band "Amboog-A-Lard").

Then, drummer Sara Lee Lucas apparently left the band after getting into a fight with Manson himself when during a show Manson reportedly poured lighter fluid on his drum set and lit it a flame. Lucas was replaced by drummer Ginger Fish.

In May of 1996, guitarist Daisy Berkowitz sited creative differences and left the band in the middle of the Antichrist Superstar sessions and after placing several classified ads the band hired Zim Zum.

Zim Zum continued to work with Marilyn Manson through the production of their latest album "Mechanical Animals". But in July of



# Spineshank are strictly diesel

There's something in the water and it's penetrated the cement, into our gutters and is currently polluting our ears. It's an ear-splitting aggression from the underground. The new wave of hard music (since calling it heavy metal just isn't P.C. these days). And from this faction of bands, with names like Korn, Limp Bizkit, and Deftones comes something unique and something brazen from the Los Angeles area. Maybe not as trendy to the middle-class TV masses as a double-café lattes, but it is, after all, called Spineshank. And with their violent debut, Strictly Diesel, you can be sure

that your ears will never be the same and your parents will continue to suck down things like those double-café lattes to ease their nerves from the entangled and hostile attack.

"Hell yeah," Spineshank's singer, Johnny Santos, proclaims when asked if Spineshank is metal for the nineties. "Long live heavy fucking metal," he snarls. "It's got to stay alive somehow.

"There is always going to be this kind of music, and I'm going to scream until the day I stop doing this. Fear Factory has managed to stay afloat for seven years. We're out here to have a very long career, doing what we love to do best and to keep this thing alive. Face it, music is coming back hard. I don't think it ever really left, I just think it got lost for a little while and it got recycled, just like music does all the time. It's a good thing because now, more commercial and corporate rock is going to have to start paying more attention to what we're doing. They'll see that this music is not going away."

When Santos makes reference to Fear Factory, he does it as a signpost for what Spineshank is trying to accomplish as musicians and out of



fuse Spineshank to the backbone of hardened music.


"We met Dino (Cazares, Fear Factory's guitarist) at that Sick Of It All show and we gave him a demo. We also know that people like Dino gets demos all the time. Heck, even now, people are giving me demos," laughs Santos at Spineshank's luck. "Three or four days later, Dino called and said that he really liked our demo. He asked us to open up for them. We were like, 'What? No, really, who is this on the phone?' We thought it was one of our friends fucking with us. It was Godsend. We got to open up our first show with Coal Chamber and Fear Factory in LA. We spent four months rummaging through the streets of LA pass-

sheer personal respect. Along with guitarist Mike Sarkisyan, bassist Robert Garcia and drummer Tom Decker, the odds of you ever hearing of Spineshank would be close to nil had it not been for the devoted bond that has developed between the two bands. Initially, Spineshank was a hack garage band, Basic Enigma, until their old guitarist showed up to a jam session with Fear Factory's ingenious first, *Demanufacture*.

"I literally sat down, in a seat, like I was back in kindergarten," admits Santos from the New York office of Roadrunner Records when discussing Fear Factory's metal-churned-machine aberration. "I was totally blown out of the water. At that point, we packed up all our shit and said 'that's it, we're done, let's go home." The band broke up.


A great martial arts instructor, and personal friend of mine, said "in the presence of nothing, do something." While that Taoist philosophy may not have sprung from the walls of the Montreal gym to a down-beaten rehearsal space in Los Angeles, it was, nevertheless, a message that Santos heard loud and clear.

Purging the drawing board,



the band that would be Spineshank wrote and recorded some tracks. Enough to produce a demo and print up some flyers. By this point, they were looking forward to attending an upcoming hardcore punkers, Sick Of It All show. Little did they know that show would change their lives and

ing out flyers to put our names on the map. We walked into that gig with nothing and walked out with over a hundred people on our mailing list. At that point, we started playing our asses off. If we weren't playing, we'd be in clubs, passing out demos and flyers,



then heading over to Dino's place to eat some tacos. The harder we worked, the more things started to pan out for us. We got introduced to Roadrunner Records and it was a snowball effect. Eight months later we found ourselves with a record deal."

Immediate history details the rest as Dino (known to the guys as "Pops") continues to help guide Spineshank through the twisted world of the music business. With all the hype, all the business-types luring like vultures to cash in on Spineshank's brand of punishment, the band knew that recording their debut, *Strictly Diesel*, would be no easy task. Along with co-producers Jay Baumgardener and Amir Derakh (of Orgy) and programmer Josh Abraham (Orgy, Limp Bizkit re-mixes), Spineshank was prepped to vent the monstrosity.

"Jay Gordon, who is also the singer from Orgy (the first band signed to Korn's Elementree Records label) and Amir, both worked on the Coal Chamber record," says Santos about Strictly Diesel's recording and production. "They had a relationship with Roadrunner, because Coal Chamber and Spineshank are on the same label. It was an amazing recording experience. We were in one room of the studio, Korn was in another, and Orgy was all over the place. Three bands, and one big party going on for nearly three months. Korn would be in our control room getting lit, or we'd be in there's, doing the same thing. It was pretty crazy."

Before images of a Hedonistic Club Med for modern hard music dances through your synapse, keep in mind that Spineshank was a band that had little more than lint in their pockets, and still had to put their record companies' money where their mouth was. The hunger, rage, and fury

all played major parts in making their debut happen.

"We got a record deal and went to a nice studio to record our first album, but our lives did not change," says Santos matter-of-factly. "In fact, things got worse. Everybody's life was practically falling apart during the recording of this album. There was a lot of fighting among the band in the studio, but that's natural. We're four different guys, with different opinions and ideas about what the disc should be like. Every guy in our band is so strong-minded, and opinionated, that it can be hard to find common ground. I think it was also a good time for venting. Everybody got a chance. When it came time for me to do my vocals, I had a lot of things going on in my personal life, that put me down. I had to slow down on my drinking half way through the recording of the album, because things were starting to get a little bit out of hand." Santos takes a long sigh.

### Spineshank is currently on tour with Fear Factory and System of the Down.

"In a way, it was good because you have to see that mirror and Jay pushed us to our limits. They pushed our buttons day in and day out. They made us do things that we never thought we could do."

And by the end, Strictly Diesel, in all its resonance and reverence is everything Spineshank had to say. An album complex in its musicianship, skilled in its writing, and forceful with its messages. Without breaching their morals and codes of respect, Santos and crew have given the musical underground something more to think about. "We try to compare our album to a roller-coaster ride," concludes Santos.



# GLAM-GRUNGE WITH BLUE MASCARA PLACEBO

"I don't regret it, that I indulged -- or that we all indulged - in that kind of life-style, we learned from it and we got a lot of inspiration for the new album."

Placebo are Brian Molko, vocals and guitar, the androgynous frontman and glamour boy, the gigantic Swede, Stefan Olsdal bass and keyboards, who seems aloof, slightly distant and dislikes interviews immensely, and drummer Steve Hewitt, who is originally from Manchester, England a town famed mainly for being the hometown of notorious football hooligans and bands like Oasis, the Happy Mondays, and Joy Division.

Androgynous Brian, aloof Stefan and Steve the hunk, have a unique look, due in part to Brian wearing dresses on stage. But it wasn't the way they looked that let them storm the charts all over Europe with their self-titled debut release. Now their second release Without You I'm Nothing, featuring the hit single "Pure Morning" has made them a world-wide success practically overnight. If the crazed fans outside the Virgin Megastore in New York are any indication.

Placebo created a media buzz even before their album or a single was released. Somehow David Bowie got hold of one of their demos, liked what he heard and invited the band to open for him on his 50th birthday party at Madison Square Garden and for three other gigs in North-America. Then they recorded their debut, self-titled album, featuring the single "Nancy Boy", went on tour with Bush, and opened for U2 on the Popmart tour in Spain.

"We had a lot of fun", remembers Brian, "And opening for Bowie was great. We like his stuff and we like him, but yeah, it was just cool that he liked us so much. We were a bit flabbergasted, to be honest, it came as a surprise and we still don't know how he got the demos. We sent them around to record companies, shopped around, but when Bowie declared himself a fan, they started jumping on us."

Rumor has it, that while on tour with U2, they shared many a hangover with the rock legends. The guys from Placebo confirm it, with screwed up faces, "Uhhh, the hangovers were lethal, but yeah, we had fun, it really was a lot of fun!"

### THE ANDROGYNOUS FACTS

It's definitely not an everyday occurrence, that both David Bowie and Lou Reed declare themselves fans of a band previously unheard of, and request to have their picture taken with Brian. His androgynous looks and get up have earned Brian Molko quite a reputation for being notorious. At Bowie's 50's anniversary bash Brian was the star of the scene, even outshining Bush's Gavin Rossdale.


"We were really surprised, you know, we love Bowie, he is a great musician, really amazing, and if one of your idols comes up and tells you that he absolutely loves your band, your music, that's really really overwhelming. We were proud that we managed to impress him with our demo, and I think we have a right to be proud of it. At the same time it didn't really change anything, you know. Well, it changed things in terms of success and making it easier for us, but it didn't change us as a band."

Brian, Stefan and Steve have started their own label, Elevator Music Ltd., to keep an eye on the business side of things. "It's weird, all the stories you hear about the music business, the life of a rock star, they're true. I always thought they're wild exaggerations, but they're true. Every stupid little detail you hear about it is true." says Brian, his big blue eyes are wide open with thick layers of mascara on his long lashes and a generous amount of eye liner. He daintily wipes the smudges off the corners of his eyes, with nails painted in the same shade of blue as his eye shadow. As he goes on to say, "For a while I was like WOW, this is unbelievable!' and dived right into it, everything. I'm not going into details, but yeah, it was pretty wild. I won't say that I didn't like it, it was fascinating. Part of me was disgusted, part of me was fascinated, it was like I was watching myself doing all that crazy stuff."

"It left me feeling so burned out. I had the wild, crazy life I always wanted and I found out that it didn't quench my thirst for creativity. It drained me and didn't give me anything back, I grew frustrated and disgusted with myself, I knew that I had to get out of it. It's a lifestyle that drags you down and keeps you down."

"I was really disillusioned, especially when it realized that my desires, my wishes, everything, were not fulfilled. Quite the opposite is true, it stops you from writing songs, it stops you from being creative. We're not a band who's in the biz to make a lot of money, we're a band because writing songs and playing music is a need we feel. Without music, yeah, I think I'd just be really really fucked up. It's a basic need we feel, something we have to do, music is damned important for us."

"I don't regret it, that I indulged - or that we all indulged - in that kind of life-style, we learned from it and we got a lot of inspiration for the new album. You know the first album dealt with sex, drugs and rock'n'roll. Crazy sex, wild sex, sex on drugs, all

that. On Without You I'm Nothing we're dealing with the after effects of that. It's funny, I tried to stay away from the subject of relationships, but it didn't really work out. I had a lot of really fucked up relationships and I needed to get it out of my system, so I wrote about it. It's not purely autobiographical, sometimes it helps to invent a character and let that character do what you wouldn't do. Like an actor who lives out things not as himself but in a role, a character he adopted!"

Acting is certainly something Brian knows a lot about. He graduated from Goldsmith College, one of the most renowned drama schools in England, and has a small part in the movie "Velvet Goldmine" after a personal request by executive producer Michael Stipe of REM. 



# Screaming Loudly with the Deftones




It's been almost two years since the

Sacramento based quintet -drummer, Abe Cunningham; bassist, Chi Cheng; guitarist, Stephen Carpenter; singer, Chino Moreno, and noise engineer, Frank Delgado - released Around the Fur. Since then, the band has criss-crossed the country on several tours putting the durability of the odometers to the test on their caravans of buses.

The band is ragged, bruised and a little crispy around the edges, but they're not taking their foot off of the gas pedal just yet, says Cunningham as he rubs his eyes trying to rouse himself from a late afternoon siesta.

He sits up favoring his right



hand, which is noticeably red and puffy from across the bus. Cunningham said the wound was selfinflicted, but by no means intentional.

Before the band went on stage at a recent show, Cunningham said he got hyped up, took a poke at a water bottle, missed the bottle and fractured and bloodied his hand.

"It looks much better now," he said gazing at an inch-long curved gash that was beginning to scab over. "It looked worse before I started taking antibiotics and it was infected and swollen."

The war wound is painful and hampers Cunningham's grip on his


drum stick, but he plays through the pain. "You just need the right amount of painkillers and it goes numb," he said grinning. The band began this year's tour in January to tour with a reunited Black Sabbath. It's opportunity Cunningham relishes. "I had the greatest time watching those guys play

when we toured with them at Ozzfest," he said.

"They even did *Into the Void*, which is one of my favorite Sabbath songs." During the song's opening verse, "Rocket engines burning fuel so fast, off into the night sky so vast," Ozzy Osbourne could almost be singing about the band's two years on the road.

"We're gonna take some time and then start working on the next album," he said. "We haven't written much new stuff on tour. That's not the way we usually like to work." A 16-track recorder the band brought on tour





hasn't seen much duty, Cunningham said he's not worried about the Deftones coming up with fresh songs strong enough to splinter the ear drums of fans. "We should probably do more writing on tour, but I guess we're just lazy," he says, laughing as a pair of vivacious young women walk past him and off the bus.

"We usually fuck around during sound check and waste alot of time trying to keep sane. We set up and jammed in a hotel not too long ago, but we usually wait until we're off the road before we get serious."

While the band's writing process is a team effort, Cunningham said he and Carpenter get the ball rolling. "Stephen and I will usually come up with the basic structure of a song, and then the everyone starts changing things around and adding parts here and there," he said. "Once we uncork the bottle everything just starts to flow, and the songs come pouring out."

It's getting close to show time as Cunningham buries himself under a

green blanket laying next to him.

Meanwhile, inside the goldleaf trimmed theater, the crowd grows restless for one of the most popular hard rock shows on the map today. A pair of paunchy off-duty police officers moonlighting as show security make lewd and lascivious eyes at the endless supply of attractive and scantily clad young women that parade past with their belly button rings and tattoos on full display. A dark-skinned temptress with a bumper sticker on her tush that advertises sex walks past, as one security guard shouts "I'm first in line."

Suddenly, the lights go out, and a sonic wave of cheers wash down from five descending tiers of fans. The now familiar opening of Be Quiet and Drive (Far Away) pulses with an intensity that sends a shudder through a big yellow sign warning the crowd of the dangers of moshing and crowd surfing.

An array of multi-colored lights set up behind the band point directly into the eyes of the front row

of fans crushed between a wall and the surging crowd behind them. The retina constricting illuminations back light the band making it hard to see them. Moreno quickly steps off the dark stage and climbs into the crowd during the hair-raising My Own Summer (Shove It).

His belt doesn't do much to help keep his loose Levis with a 40 inch waist from getting jerked down to his knees by fans. As Chino screams through the song's chorus, more and more of Moreno's boxer shorts are revealed. Watching Cunningham pummel his snare drum like John Henry trying to hammer a railroad spike through the stage floor, it's hard to believe his hand is throbbing with pain. With an hour long set

that mixes songs like Lotion from Around the Fur, Bored from Adrenaline, and a cover of Subliminal from Suicidal Tendencies' self-titled 1983 debut, the band more than satisfies the crowd's hunger for hardcore with a jagged performance.

Near the end of the show, Moreno forces a Yawp from his lungs as the band kicks into the dirty groove that drives the song Head Up.

From the side of the floor, a beefy albino buffalo of a man snorting whiskey breath rampages toward the front of the stage indiscriminately elbowing and trampling men, women and children along the way. Stopping in the middle of the crowd, the flailing monstrosity flips the bird to the 'no moshing' sign and incites the crowd into a churning boil of sweaty skin.

Moreno growls the song's refrain, and the pit responds in kind with more ferocity. Fans who walked into the show damp from the rain now leave wetter than before soaked to the bone with a glorious rock and roll sweat.


